Here are some ideas to help you write the next part of your story!

You don't have to use them all — just choose the ones that fit what happens next.

Into the Woods

You decide to follow the red light into the snowy woods. Where does it go?

Maybe to a cave, a little house, or a secret clearing under the stars?

Try to include:

- What you can see, hear, and feel (e.g., the snow was soft and cold).
- An expanded noun phrase (e.g., the tall, snowy trees).
- A sentence starting with "Suddenly," or "Then,"

Who Do You Meet?

In the woods, you meet someone!

It might be a lost elf, a talking snowman, or a tiny fairy who knows what's happening.

Try to include:

- Talking between you and the new character (use speech marks "").
- How they look or act (e.g., The elf's hat was bright green.).
- A reason why they might help you or make things tricky!

A Big Problem

Something goes wrong!

Maybe you fall in the snow, lose your torch, or hear a strange noise behind you!

Try to include:

- A short, exciting sentence to make the reader feel tense.
- A feeling word (e.g., scared, cold, brave).
- A sentence with "but" or "so" to show what happens next.
